Many People Can't Afford Housing Here

- 2010-2021: Only \$150k+ income band increased homeownership rates
- Home prices rising faster than inflation for two decades
- Neighborhoods once affordable are no longer affordable
- 'Adorable homeownership'

We have a structural problem! Our status quo isn't working

Affordable Housing + ...?

MoCo has long been a national leader in innovative affordable housing solutions.

What will we do to address the growing needs of those not served by these programs?

One approach:

Greatly increase subsidies for those who earn too much to qualify for existing affordable rental and homeownership programs.

Problem: Existing affordable housing programs are already oversubscribed, the budget is already fraught, and the needs of many vulnerable people are underserved

Are there other approaches in combination with subsidized affordable housing that can help us achieve greater affordability for more people?

Another approach:

Create housing options more people can afford, and better serve middle-income households, by allowing more types of housing in more locations.

Benefits: More tax revenue here instead of leaving the county; additional subsidized affordable rental and homeownership opportunities; reduce price competition/displacement over existing, lower-cost market-rate units

Thrive & Attainable Housing

- Allow more affordable alternatives than what is allowed today in sustainable locations
- ‘Missing middle’ homes – -plexes, garden apartments, etc.
 - People like these things!
- Transit- and corridor-oriented growth; avoid car dependent sprawl
- Reduce barriers, timeline, and costs to multi-family construction to reduce costs for homeowners and renters

How to take action!

- **SPEAK UP!** Please help me represent young people at these hearings and meetings!
- **Mobilize, mobilize, mobilize:** Neutral/positive folks less likely to show up, but are critical to winning on this issue
- **Listen and sincerely engage with people's fears:** environment, cost versus current options, eminent domain, neighborhood character, displacement risk
- **Weigh in:** tell the Council this matters to you
